Minutes: Angela provided everyone with the December minutes which were approved by Mark Stout, seconded and passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report: Michele advised it has been a quiet month. DEEP spent \$400.00 towards the Holiday Tree Lighting and sold a chair, leaving \$23,896.70 in the Operating Account. The Morse Investment and DEEP Investment dropped about \$12,000.00 due to the Market, leaving \$192,936.37 in the Morse Investment and \$106,897.98 in the DEEP Investment. Mark Strout approved the Treasurers Report, seconded and passed unanimously.

Public Relations: There was a lot of good publicity regarding the Danvers Holiday Festival and people are still talking about its great success.

The HRMS Spelling Bee will be held in the DHS Auditorium on Thursday, February 7, 2019 starting at 6:00 P.M. The snow date is Thursday, February 14. Students participating in the Spelling Bee will be fed pizza, donated by Danvers House of Pizza, prior to the event. A Bake Sale will also take place. New Business: A request came in from the Danvers High School MUN (Model United Nations) Team looking for a donation from DEEP to help defray the cost of a 3-day conference, hosted by Boston College, that is being held at the Westin Copley in Boston. A motion by Mark Strout was made to donate \$500.00, seconded and passed unanimously.

Step Up for Colleen 5K Walk/Run sent in a letter thanking DEEP for sponsoring the walk last year and asking if we would like to sponsor it again this year. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to sponsor the Colleen Ritzer Walk for \$500.00.

Northshore ARC also sent in a request to accommodate books for students who are attending an event at the Cummings Center. Unfortunately, we had to deny the request due to it not being in our budget.

DECA had 175 students go to the District Conference competition at Merrimack College earlier in the month. 145 qualified to compete at the State Conference in March. Each student needs \$450.00 to attend the conference and there are some with financial concerns. A motion was made by Mark Strout to give DECA \$2,500.00 to help defray the cost of going on to the State Conference competition in March. The motion was also seconded and passed unanimously.

The MLK Day Tribute is on Monday, January 21, from 4 to 6 P.M. in the atrium at DHS. It is a fabulous event with some socializing, various singing groups, beautiful artwork from our elementary and middle school students, speakers and some treats to eat. Come on by!

Essex North Shore Agricultural & Technical School is hosting a community-wide presentation of *If They Had Known* on Wednesday at 6:30 P.M. It is a documentary spoken by kids to kids and families about the risks of the current "party culture". Parents, guardians, grandparents, students, etc. are welcome to attend.

DEEP received a thank you letter from Falconize for the donation of \$1,500.00 that we gave them back in December to help defray the cost of their trip to Spain. The trip to Spain has been cancelled due to other schools cancelling. Alex Grover advised that they will now be going to Disney in Florida the first week of May. A motion was made to re-allocate the money from the Spain trip to the Florida trip, seconded and passed unanimously.

DanversCARES: Angela is the liaison person for DEEP and attends monthly meetings. She advised that DanversCARES will be holding their first Family Workshop on Tuesday, January 22, from 6 to 7 P.M. at the Peabody Institute Library.
