Minutes: October minutes were provided by Angela, approved by Mark Strout, seconded and passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report: Michele provided her report and advised that Investments are doing well. October was a big month with our biggest event of the year. The Wine Tasting netted over \$10,600. We are still waiting on some sponsorship checks which will appear on next month's report. Currently, there is \$20,928.00 in the DEEP Operating Account; \$209.033.01 in the Morse Investment and \$114.901.37 in the DEEP Investment; for a total of \$344,862.38 between the three accounts. Mark Strout approved the October Treasurer's Report, it was seconded and passed unanimously.

Public Relations: Thank you to Myrna Fearer who wrote a nice article in the paper on the Wine Tasting.

Wine Tasting Recap: First, a huge Thank You to all of the volunteers and sponsors, this evening could not happen without your help and support. Attendance was down this year, but we were still very happy with our event. The Wine Tasting has been going on for 21 years and competing with lots of other organizations. It might just be time to do something different. The Co-Chairs will meet after the first of the year to brainstorm on other options.

Teacher Grants: Mari advised that DEEP is going to test doing two rounds of Teacher Grants this year. Teachers can apply online in December, and again in the spring. All information on applying for a grant (where to find the application and guidelines) can be found on the DEEP website. A big thank you to Jeff Liberman for getting all of this set up for us.

Downtown Holiday Festival: This year the Tree Lighting will take place on Saturday, December 7, from 2:00 to 5:00 pm. We are extremely excited to be co-sponsoring this event with DanversCARES. There are numerous local businesses participating in the event: East Boston Savings Bank will be hosting pictures with Santa at the bank from 2:00 to 4:30; Maple Street Church will have cookies and cocoa and a Living Nativity display; a few of our local school choral groups will be singing; and Essex Tech will be providing face painting. We will be posting on all our social media sites to keep everyone in town updated on all the festivities for the day and are anticipating a fun time for all that attend.

Thorpe Presentation: Thorpe School special educators were awarded a \$1,500 DEEP grant for *Sensory Hallways*. The *Primary Hallway* is utilized every single day, and Thorpe Principal Rita Ward could not thank DEEP enough for the grant. She advised that the *Sensory Hallways* have been a positive addition to the school, and that there were so many benefits to students having the opportunity to take a break, get out of their seats, and move around during the day. There is also an *Intermediate Hallway* with a couple of tactile activities on the wall. The idea was so intriguing to Board members that, at the end of our meeting, several of them checked out the *Sensory Hallways* and were even seen hopping and enjoying it themselves. Thank you to Rita for hosting this month's DEEP meeting and for the great presentation!

Old Business: Dr. Dana advised that the Smith School Building Project is moving forward. The groundbreaking was held in October and, come spring, you will see progress.

New Business: Mary Wermers advised that this year's HRMS Spelling Bee will be held at DHS on Wednesday, January 22, at 6:00 P.M. with a snow day of Wednesday, January 29. The Spelling Bee is earlier this year because it must be completed by January 31.

Dr. Colombino, Principal of DHS, advised that our fall sports teams had a great season and wanted to wish the Girls Volleyball Team luck as they were off to States today. DECA will complete at Merrimack College in December. They are in search of judges. If anyone is interested, please reach out.

Mary Beth Verry advised that the winter edition of the DEEP Newsletter will be going out soon.
