Tour Classes: Dr. Colombino took us to two classrooms at DHS that have benefitted from DEEP grants in the past. Our first tour was of Tracie Ewing's Fundamental English class. The students were working with magnetic word tiles, one set that color codes the separate parts of speech, and another that has synonyms on the opposite side. The students are using these to learn sentence structure and to add interest to their simple sentences. We also visited Alex Carroll's Advanced Placement Chemistry class where students were using conductivity probes to determine the conductivity of an aqueous solution. Thank you to Ms. Ewing and Mr. Carroll for allowing us to visit their classrooms.

Minutes: January minutes were provided by Angela, approved by Mark Strout, seconded and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Michele provided her report and advised that we are right on track. Payment was made to the administrative assistant, the MLK Celebration and the Ritzer Walk. There is currently \$22,391.69 in the DEEP Operating Account; \$215,331.76 in the Morse Investment and \$118,328.55 in the DEEP Investment, for a total of \$356,052.00 between all accounts. The Treasurer's Report was approved by Mark Strout, seconded and passed unanimously.

Public Relations: The MLK Celebration will take place on Monday, January 20, from 4:00 to 6:00 P.M. in the DHS Atrium. DEEP is one of the many sponsors of this year's celebration. There will be light snacks, entertainment by several Danvers Public Schools choral groups, the Brandeis University a cappella group, guest speakers, student artwork and a video from SUFA (Students United for Acceptance).

Spelling Bee: On Wednesday, January 22, the DEEP/HRMS Spelling Bee will take place in the DHS Auditorium at 6:00 P.M. Approximately 40 students in grades 6 to 8 qualified to participate in the Spelling Bee. The winner will take a paper test to try and qualify for a spot in the regional Spelling Bee in March. Thank you to George Koutsos from CrossCountry Mortgage for his generous donation of the t-shirts that will be worn by the students during the Spelling Bee. Thank you to Laura and Jim Speliotis from New Danvers House of Pizza for their donation of the pizzas that students will enjoy before they take the stage. None of this would be possible without their generosity.

Teacher Grants: Mari updated us on the overwhelmingly positive response to piloting two rounds of grants this year, one being in the winter and the other in the spring. We have 18 grants, totaling almost \$24,000.00, and budgeted for \$15,000.00. A discussion was had to see if DEEP can support this first round of grants. After much discussion, our Investments have done well, all were in favor to withdraw from the Investments.

Glenn Boutchie made a motion to withdraw \$20,000.00 from Cornerstone Financial to help cover the grant request. A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously.

New Business: 156 Students from DHS DECA qualified for the state competition that is being held February 27 to 29 in Boston. A request was made for \$2,500.00 to help assist the students that will be attending. A motion was made and seconded. This motion passed unanimously. Meghan Beaulieu is looking for judges.
