For the first time in its' history, DEEP is offering teachers two opportunities to apply for a DEEP Teacher Grant in SY20. The winter cycle of applications was opened to teachers on November 25. The deadline for applications – for support of spring initiatives and curriculum enhancements – was December 16. The Grant Committee is currently reviewing applications.

Teacher Grants are awarded to educators so that they may offer educational enrichment, innovative programming and creative opportunities to students in the Danvers Public Schools. Teachers may apply individually or as part of a group.

The grant application will be opened again in the spring for fall 2020 awards. Teachers may apply once per cycle.

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

Several agencies allow 0% - 3.5% down payments, such as the Federal Housing Administration (FHA), Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA-RD). Many State Housing Agencies allow borrowers to receive cash assistance for down payments, too.

S.T.E.a.M. SUMMER COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

3D SCULPTURE Through a series of innovative and engaging exercises, you will work with materials including fiber, paper, wire, clay, found objects and more to create three-dimensional works.

ACTING FOR THE STAGE Learn the art of Narrative Pantomime, how to take stage direction, how to develop character, projection, stage presence and techniques for memorizing lines. The session will culminate in a performance for friends and family.

ADVENTURES IN DRAWING & PAINT-

ING Explore the principles of drawing and painting from observation and imagination. Learn value, gesture, contour lines, color and composition using a range of materials. Each session offers new challenges to allow for returning students.

ANIMATION Learn about animation and all of its possibilities. Develop drawing techniques to tell stories with still and moving images, using a variety of approaches.

ART ALIVE! Explore art from around the world that focuses on our favorite living things. We will explore these living wonders through the eyes of artists from Beverly to Bulgaria and beyond!

ART EXPLORERS Create eclectic 2D and 3D art collections using clay, wire, fabric, paint and other materials.

ART-FULL PLAY Relax and clear your mind through structured creative play. We will begin with doodling to open up channels of creativity. You will be guided through the simple process with pen and paper, then, expand your experience by introducing other media.

ART, NATURE, AND THE ENVIRON-

MENT Take a closer look at the marvels we experience every day, from tiny insects to mountain peaks. Use the color, textures, and patterns found in nature to influence our drawings. Create mixed media paintings and collages that explore the unique connection between art and nature.

AUTHORS CLUB Become an author! Learn about story elements, narrative story writing, illustration and create your very own hardback book.

CARTOONING AND COMICS WORK-

SHOP Create original cartoons using visual storytelling through script writing, character development and background design. Storyboarding leads you from initial sketches to final printing of completed comic narratives. Use illustrative techniques to sketch, ink, color, write and print finished comics.

CLAY STUDIO Create 3D works using one of the oldest materials in art history – clay. Explore different techniques such as slab rolling, pinch pots, molding, and coil building by only using our hands. Customize each project to your liking and bring home some works of art!

COMIC BOOK ART Develop and expand a personal style of comic book art using dreams, superheroes and the works of famous artists. Story, character development and drawing techniques are addressed.

CRAZY CHEMISTS Explore chemistry through a hands-on approach. Learn about freezing point depression as we make our own ice cream. Explore how to make awesome bouncy balls and fun slime. Make cool art using homemade bubble solution!

CREATING WITH YARN Experiment with repurposing yarn scraps into art, and study fibers as you weave small wall hangings, print with yarn, make pom-pom animals and more!

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY Learn the basics of using your digital camera. You need to provide your own digital camera.

DRAWING AND CARTOONING Learn the tips and tricks of creating your own characters, scenes, and action-filled adventures with drawing basics including line, shape and composition. Explore fantasy worlds, monsters, dragons, unicorns, fairies and elves.

DRAWING Develop your ability to look carefully at your subjects, to recognize relationships, and to develop your drawings.

FASHION DESIGN Develop skills in fashion illustration, pattern making, fabric selection, draping and garment construction. The final project is the creation of a piece to be viewed and critiqued by peers and instructors at the conclusion of the program.

FASHION WITH (RE)PURPOSE Learn how to alter and design pre-existing clothing into something new and fresh! Experiment with found materials, objects and reclaimed fabrics to reimagine garments. Learn basic hand stitching and machine sewing techniques, fastenings, fabric dying, embellishment and screen printing.

FIBERS Explore how artists use cloth, paper and other materials to create fiber works. Techniques may include sewing, printing on fabric, beading, papermaking, batik, knitting, weaving and more, to make wearable art and 3D objects from a wide range of soft media.

FILMMAKING Be part of a real film crew in this live-action moviemaking class. From concept to shooting to performing, you will learn the fundamentals of the great collaborative process of filmmaking. Creativity, teamwork and visual art come together to create a movie premier on the final day of class.

FUN WITH BIOLOGY: BUGS AND PLANTS, OH MY! From walking sticks to snakes, from growing things to popcorn - students will investigate subjects, conduct experiments, and then create interesting biology-themed art projects!

GRAPHIC DESIGN The art or profession of visual communication that combines images, words, and ideas to convey information and express ideas to an audience. This class introduces the skill and concepts fundamental to graphic design, including process, conceptual thinking, making and production. This course is not computer based.

IPHONEOGRAPHY (SMARTPHONEOG-RAPHY) iPhoneography is the latest photography trend to hit full stride in the art world. It challenges photographers to take high quality photos with their iPhone, and to turn everyday moments into works of art.

JEWELRY MAKING Learn wire wrapping techniques to create jewelry and other crafts from materials found during your journey to the shores of Beverly. Design pendants, wind chimes and other beautiful creations using beach glass, beads and other natural items.

JUNK BOX CREATIONS Do you want to be an inventor? Use recyclable materials to create useful inventions.

MINI ENGINEERS Imagine and explore simple engineering concepts while working in teams to design, build, and create. Using materials such as clay, pipe cleaners, Legos, and foil, Design boats, assembly lines, mazes, towers, parachutes, and domes.

MIXED MEDIA Work with collages, rocks, watercolors, acrylics, natural materials, mosaics and more. This fun program teaches you to explore new ways of being creative with all kinds of materials to create open art.

MONSTER MASH DRAWING Develop illustration skills using monsters as inspiration. Monsters, like our imaginations, follow no rules! We'll build visual art skills and drawing techniques using a variety of materials such as graphite, ink pens and colored pencils.

OUT OF THIS WORLD 3...2...1...Blast Off! Enjoy a variety of creative projects that explore everything outer-space! Create giant paper mâché planets, glow-in-the-dark constallations and life-size extraterrestrials.

PAINTING Introduces a variety of painting techniques. You will produce canvases on a variety of subjects and create your own solutions. You will develop critical skills for evaluating your own work and that of others.

PAPER ARTS + BOOK MAKING Explore a variety of ways to transform an ordinary piece of paper into something extraordinary. You'll learn techniques like folding, cutting, layering and sewing to make your very own paper toys, pop-up cards, mini books and more.

PRINTMAKING Design and create your own product line: notebooks, custom stationary, gift wrap, patterned fabric and more using screen printing, stamping and stencil techniques. Learn basic design principles and be inspired by artists working in both Fine Arts and Graphic Design fields.

SCULPTING WITH NATURE Begin in the classroom with an inspirational introduction to recognizable works of art, move towards construction techniques, and finally travel outside where you will be interacting with nature in its rawest form.

SCULPTURE WORKSHOP Learn a variety of techniques for building functional and sculptural works of art, including slab, coil and pinch pot methods. Projects consider age and skill level and allow returning students to continue building skills, knowledge and technique.

SEWING 101 Learn the skill of hand and machine sewing while creating unique works of art. Learn how to thread a needle as you experience how fun sewing projects can be.

SKETCHBOOK & ILLUSTRATION Learn to express your ideas; find, explore and develop your own style in a sketchbook filled with personal narratives. Use shapes, expressive marks, drawing distortions, and other methods to transmute emotions into uplifting art.

SUPER SCIENTISTS Interested in Groovy Science, Cake Chemistry, or Flight Physics? Super Scientists' hands-on activities allow you to investigate topics such as polymers, gravity, chemical reactions, and more.

T-SHIRT DESIGN Use fabric paint, tie-dye and batik to design one of a kind creation. All students must provide five prewashed, 100% cotton t-shirts to decorate.

THE THIRD DIMENSION Discover how math and science are used to help create 3D sculptures that fly, move or float using wire, paper, polymer clay and more. Using multiple materials, you will also give old items a new life, taking the ordinary and creating the extraordinary.

WATT'S UP? Focuses on the importance of light in art, whether in the process of creation, or in the art piece itself. Art will range from printmaking to sculpture, and you will learn more about the science behind light!

WHERE NO ONE HAS GONE BEFORE...

WIRE AND METAL SCULPTURE Experiment with different approaches to wire sculpture to create both three dimensional forms as well as creative relief sculptures. Form as well as texture and color will be important design tools

WONDROUS WATERCOLOR Paint outside the lines! Create realistic and experimental watercolors with a variety of techniques like splash, splatter, wash, wet-on-wet and dry brush. We'll even experiment with salt.

YOGA, MINDFULNESS AND ART Enter a safe space where we'll use yoga as a tool to develop an awareness of ourselves and others. Movement will be paired with journaling, poetry, and drawing as methods of self-expression.
