Treasurer's Report: Michele provided an update on the financials and advised that a check was sent out for teacher grants, another to ICE Effects for the ice sculpture that was at the Tree Lighting and another to The Friends of the Danvers Human Rights and Inclusion Committee for the MLK Event. Investments look good and are up \$5,000. We received almost \$800 in memberships and the luminarias from the Tree Lighting brought in \$310. Mary Beth and Michele met with Cornerstone Financial and determined that there was no reason for a change right now. It was decided to keep doing what we are doing. Cornerstone did suggest that if we were to do another large withdrawal, we should split it between the accounts instead of just pulling from one account. Glenn Boutchie made a motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded and passed unanimously. Thank you, Michele!
