Minutes: Angela presented the October minutes which were approved by Glenn Boutchie, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Michele provided the Treasurer's Report and advised that financials improved a little bit. There is \$19,584.14 in the DEEP Operating Account; \$175,501.02 in the Morse Investment; and \$68,604.93 in the DEEP Investment, totaling \$263,690.09 between all the accounts. Richard Stoney approved the Treasurer's Report which was seconded and passed unanimously.

Membership Update: Memberships are up and doing well! If you have not renewed your DEEP membership yet, there is still plenty of time!

Wine & Food Tasting: We are happy with the outcome and everything couldn't have run any more smoothly.
