Minutes: Angela provided November minutes which were approved by Glenn Boutchie, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Michele provided the Treasurer's Report and advised that financials improved a little bit. There is \$19,985.27 in the DEEP Operating Account; \$183,925.45 in the Morse Investment; and \$71,727.38 in the DEEP Investment – total Operating and Investments is \$275,638.10. Michele and Mary Beth will be meeting with Cornerstone Financial today and an update will be provided at the January meeting. Glenn approved the Treasurer's Report.

Membership Update: Memberships are up and doing well! If you have not renewed your DEEP membership yet, there is still plenty of time!

Teacher Grants: Mari advised that she had a great group of readers this year and there were 27 grant applications requesting approximately \$21,000. The Grant Committee will read and rate the grants as they did last year. Due to the lower funds raised at this year's Wine Tasting, the DEEP Board will meet and discuss if they will fund half now and half later. However, as mentioned in the Treasurer's Report, Mary Beth and Michele will meet with Cornerstone Financial to see if and what we can take out of our investments.

Holiday Festival: This year's Tree Lighting was a new collaboration between DEEP, Danvers Recreation and Endicott Park and was very well received. The Tree Lighting made the front page of the Salem News, DCAT took over 350 photos and Rockland Trust sponsored Santa. We had a great group of student volunteers from Danvers High School, DanversCARES, Holten-Richmond Middle School and Essex Tech, and are very grateful for all of their help. We were very happy with the entire event from start to finish, although we wish the weather had been a little more cooperative during the day. Fortunately, the weather improved in time for the Tree Lighting and Candy Cane Hunt – which, by the way, was awesome!

HRMS Spelling Bee: The 14th Annual HRMS Spelling Bee will take place on Wednesday, January 25th, at 6:00 PM in the Danvers High School auditorium. The snow date is Thursday the 26th.
